



Eight surfaces to promote your message

Design each of the eight sides and the top if desired.

Materials: light weight paper, paint, markers, colored pencils, + any other media.

Combine printed designs and hand made text and images to create desired messaging.

Materials

Kite Construction: Main Body

- 4 dowel rods, 3/8 inch by 36 inches
- 4 dowel rods, 3/8 inch by 12 inches
- Electrical tape
- Shipping (clear plastic) tape
- Hot glue gun/sticks
- Ruler, pencil
- Thin plastic tablecloth in festive color/s



Optional Materials


Optional:

- ½ dowel rod or sturdy yardstick (if you want to hold the kite like a sign)
- Heavy duty string (if you want to fly the kite in the air)



Basic Materials

- 4 dowel rods, 3/8 inch by 36 inches
- 4 dowel rods, 3/8 inch by 12 inches
- Electrical tape
- Shipping (clear plastic) tape
- Hot glue gun/sticks
- Ruler, pencil
- Thin plastic tablecloth in festive color/s



Step 1


Cross pieces provide structural support


I used hot glue and electrical tape.

Step 2

Attach the cross pieces to the long dowel rods.

Some instructions suggest carving the ends of the cross pieces in a U-shape to secure against the long dowels. I found this to be unnecessary. Glue and tape were sufficient.











Step 3:

Cut the plastic tablecloth to fit (about 180 cm or 5 feet). Wrap around and secure with tape.



Step 4:

Add messaging and images.

Embellish with ribbons, strips of the plastic materials, beads, etc.
